

Local and State Rules govern this competition.

- 1. **ELIGIBILITY** Open to all California residents. Entries must have been grown by the Exhibitor within the county, district and/or community that the Exhibitor represents.
 - a. Exception for Arrangements divisions.

ENTRY INFORMATION

- 2. ENTRY FEES \$2.00 per Entry
 - a. Fees are NON-refundable.
- 3. ENTRY LIMIT 2 Entries <u>PER</u> Class for Roses & Cut Flowers | 1 Entry <u>PER</u> Class for All Other Floriculture.
- 4. ENTRY REMOVAL Accepted plants shall not be removed from exhibition until the Fair closes.
 - a. Entries not collected on Release Day will be discarded.
- 5. **ENTRY RELEASE** Entries must be picked up on release day. Entries will only be released by presenting your claim check, personal identification, or a signed letter of authorization from the exhibitor.

ENTRY RULES*

- 6. All Entry containers are to be labeled on the bottom with the Exhibitor's name, division, and class information.
 - a. Do <u>NOT</u> use irreplaceable containers.

PLANT CARE

- 7. Upon receipt, Floriculture & Horticulture will be under the exclusive charge of the Department Coordinators. Coordinators will give daily care (watering).
 - a. If you do not want your plant watered during the Fair, please notify a Coordinator at time of delivery to opt-out.

Local and State Rules govern this competition.

- 1. ELIGIBILITY FOR AMATEURS Open to all Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, and Master arrangers.
 - a. Once an Exhibitor has participated in an advanced classification, the Exhibitor may <u>NOT</u> show again in a lower classification at any future time.
- 2. **ELIGIBILITY FOR PROFESSIONALS** Open to California Professional Florists, Floral Event Designers, and any individual who has received compensation for Floral Arranging.

ENTRY INFORMATION

- 3. **ENTRY FEES** \$3.00 per Entry for <u>AMATEURS</u> | \$5.00 per Entry for <u>PROFESSIONALS</u> a. Fees are NON-refundable.
- 4. ENTRY REMOVAL Accepted plants shall not be removed from exhibition until the Fair closes.a. Entries not collected on Release Day will be discarded.
- 5. **ENTRY RELEASE** Entries must be picked up on release day. Entries will only be released by presenting your claim check, personal identification, or a signed letter of authorization from the exhibitor.

CLASS DEFINITIONS FOR AMATEURS

- > **Novice** | An Exhibitor who has never won a Blue Ribbon in an organized Flower Show.
- Intermediate | An Exhibitor who has won at least 1 but not more than 5, Blue Ribbons in an organized Flower Show.
- > Advanced | An Exhibitor who has won 6 or more Blue Ribbons in an organized Flower Show.
- Master | Lecturers, floral teachers, judges or anyone who has received remuneration for their services in the field of Flower Arrangements.

ARRANGEMENT REQUIREMENTS

- 6. <u>AMATEUR</u> Exhibits to occupy an area <u>NO</u> more than 36" wide x 46" tall.
 - a. <u>PROFESSIONAL</u> Exhibits to occupy an area <u>NO</u> more than 48" wide x 60" tall.
- 7. State conservation material is not permitted for use in entries.
- 8. Foliage is permitted in all arrangements unless otherwise stated in the schedule.
 - a. Succulents are classified as foliage.
- 9. Some fresh plant material or flowers (including fruit and/or foliage) is required in all arrangements unless otherwise stated in division rules.
- 10. <u>NO</u> artificial fruit, flowers, vegetables, and/or foliage may be used except in the notated classes. Sprayed, glycerinated, and/or any other treated natural material will be considered dry material.
 - a. Dry material may be used for line material except where fresh material is indicated.
 - b. No fresh plant material may be sprayed.
- 11. Material used in arrangements does <u>NOT</u> have to be grown by the Exhibitor.
- 12. All Entry containers are to be labeled on the bottom with the Exhibitor's name, division, and class information.
 - a. Do <u>NOT</u> use irreplaceable containers.

PLANT CARE

13. Upon receipt, Floriculture & Horticulture will be under the exclusive charge of the Department Coordinators. Coordinators will give daily care (watering).

- a. If you do not want your plant watered during the Fair, please notify a Coordinator at time of delivery to opt-out.
- 14. Coordinators reserve the right to remove wilted or spoiled material from any Entry.

PUBLICITY

15. The Marin County Fair reserves the right to photograph any work in the exhibition for educational, catalog, website, or publicity purposes.

LIABILITY

16. The County of Marin, Marin County Fair, and/or its contractors will not be responsible for loss or damage which may occur from any cause. Any entries received damaged will not be juried.
