

#### **DEPARTMENT RULES & REGULATIONS**

Local and State Rules govern this competition.

- 1. **ELIGIBILITY** Open to all California Amateur Homebrewers over 21 years of age. Amateur is defined as a person who does not hold an enology degree, and who makes homebrew only non-commercially, without assistance from any commercial brewing facility. No commercial brews may be entered in this competition.
- 2. **ELIGIBILITY** Entries may not be brewed wholly or in part using the facilities or equipment of a commercial brewing or brew on premises of said establishment.

#### **ENTRY INFORMATION**

- 3. **ENTRY FEES** \$10.00 per Entry | \$4.00 per Label
  - a. Fees are NON-refundable.
- 4. ENTRY LIMIT 1 Entry per Style. (No limit per class)
  - a. Exhibitors must provide three (3) bottles or cans per entry.
- 5. **ENTRY REMOVAL** Accepted works (including sold works) shall not be removed from exhibition until the Fair closes.
- 6. **ENTRY RELEASE** Entries must be picked up on release day. Entries will only be released by presenting your claim check, personal identification, or a signed letter of authorization from the exhibitor. All entries left at the fair will become the property of MaSH and will not be returned.

#### **ENTRY SUBMISSION**

- 7. To assure the anonymity of Exhibitors, Entries must meet the following standardization requirements:
  - a. Each entry must consist of three (3) 12 oz. plain brown (or green) bottles. (For example 2 entries is 6 bottles total). Unlabeled cans also be accepted.
  - b. NO identifying marks may be present on the bottles such as raised lettering, embossing, or labels.
  - c. All bottles must have plain (or blacked out using a marking pen) crown caps.
- 8. Each submitted bottle should have the Exhibitor's name, class number, style name and/or number identified (Example: John Doe, **13**, **Irish Stout**).
  - a. Labels are to be affixed by rubber band no tape or adhesive may be used. See <a href="http://www.bjcp.org/docs/BJCP">http://www.bjcp.org/docs/BJCP</a> BottleID.pdf for label template.
  - b. Entry categories marked with an asterisk (\*) must include BJCP required details in the description field on the entry form (e.g. strength, special ingredients, color, etc.) as detailed for that style in the BJCP 2015 guidelines,

#### **JUDGING**

- 9. This competition is sanctioned by the *American Homebrew Association* (AHA) and the *Beer Judge Certification Program* (BJCP).
  - a. The competition is using the BJCP scoring system and 2021 Style Guidelines. (Refer to the BJCP website for more information: http://www.bjcp.org/stylecenter.php)
- 10. The Marin Society of Homebrewers (MaSH), whose members coordinate the judging, reserve the right to make all final decisions regarding entry eligibility and contest procedures.
  - a. All entries become the property of MaSH and will not be returned.
- 11. Fair Management retains the right to refuse or disqualify any entries that do not meet specifications of the rules of competition.
- 12. Fair Management reserves the right to combine judging groups based on the number of entries.
  - a. All possible effort will be made to combine similar styles. All brews in combined judging groups will be judged according to the style they were originally entered.

#### **DISPLAY**

13. Installation of all items is completed by a professional team whose decisions are final. No alterations or changes (e.g. location, lighting, etc.) may be made by the exhibitor or any staff member at any time.

#### **PUBLICITY**

14. The Marin County Fair reserves the right to photograph any work in the exhibition for educational, catalog, website, or publicity purposes.

#### LIABILITY

15. The County of Marin, Marin County Fair, and/or its contractors will not be responsible for loss or damage which may occur from any cause. Any entries received damaged will not be juried.
